

Absentee Ballot Information

Feb. 8, 2011, Lee's Summit R-7 Election



If you are going to be out of town on February 8, you may cast an absentee ballot as follows:

1. Vote in person at the Jackson County Election Board Office, Cass County Courthouse or Kansas City Board of Election Commissioners. (You must vote at the office where you are registered.)
2. Vote by mail.

You may also vote absentee if your job will keep you from voting. (For example, if you must leave for work in Kansas City early in the morning and return in the late evening.)

To vote by mail:

- Send this information to your election board (Jackson or Cass County or Kansas City)
 - Printed name as registered and date of birth
 - Home address and phone number
 - Mailing address if different from home
 - Your signature as registered
 - Last four digits of social security number
 - Reason for needing to vote absentee
- You will receive a ballot by mail.
- The ballot envelope must be **notarized** before you send it back to the election board. (If confined to your home due to illness, your ballot envelope does not have to be notarized but you must still sign the ballot envelope.)
- The last day to process your request for a ballot is the Wednesday prior to the election day, Feb. 2 for the Feb. 8 election.
- Your notarized ballot must reach the election board by 5 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 8. (If hand delivered it must be brought in by the voter.)

To cast absentee ballot in person (Jackson County voters):

You may vote from 8:30 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 28 until 5 p.m. Monday, Feb. 7, at the Jackson County Election Board Office one block off the square in Independence. They are open Monday through Friday 8:30-5 (the office does not close for lunch). They will also offer voting the two Saturdays before the election date from 8:30-12:30.

Absentee voting procedures (in person) are similar in Cass County and at the Kansas City office. Please call your office for more information.



If you would like to vote in the Feb. 8, 2011, school election, you must be registered by Jan. 12

Local voters may register at the following locations

Jackson County voters

- All area City Hall offices
- All Mid-Continent Libraries
- Jackson County Election Office, Independence. Square (open 8:30-5 M-F)
- Any Missouri license bureau

Cass County voters

- Most City Hall offices including Lake Winnebago
- Any public library
- Cass County Election Office (open 8-4:30 M-F)
- Any Missouri license bureau

This form must be postmarked by Jan. 12.
